## Fountains of Forward Thinking!



A personal message from Gail Maguire

Dear Reader

Planning for the future work of the Fountain Centre is no easy task. Advances in the treatment of cancer mean that the NHS is reorganising services, and the Centre needs to prepare carefully to adapt and fit in with this new landscape.

### Less is more

That's why you will be seeing less of me for a few months! It's been a long time since 1998 when the Centre opened and we've been pretty well flat out developing our support services for patients their families and carers. I'm taking time out now to plan for the next stages of that development.

In other words, clear thinking time away from the daily hubbub! But I need your help!

### The Fountain Centre in context

First, though, a word of background on this exciting new project.

Historically chemotherapy services have been located at hospital sites where specialist personnel and facilities are based. This often requires patients to travel quite lengthy distances to receive treatment. Opportunities to make use of chemotherapy are ever-expanding, as is the development of new drugs approved for use in the NHS. Increasing numbers of referrals to oncology services have seen workload rise exponentially over the last decade – and inevitably this rise will continue for the foreseeable future.

Providing services nearer to patients' homes will

require a sustained shift in the way those services are delivered. They will be more personalised and easier to fit into peoples' busy lives. In essence, it is about improving the patients' experience of care and the quality of life for cancer survivors.

### The way ahead

I'm going to be charting the way ahead for the Fountain Centre in considerable detail. My work will consider what cancer care will be like by 2023, and ask how we can best continue to serve.

- Will we need to direct some resources away from the Fountain Centre itself, currently our main base situated within St Luke's Cancer Centre?
- Should we set up a new fully-resourced the Fountain Centre satellite somewhere in our catchment area?
- Should we set up mini-centres in hospices, GP surgeries, or community centres?
- How will changes in NHS structures and practices impact on our relationships with health service professionals?

### How you can help

I'd be pleased to have your input. All comments will be kept in complete confidence. You might want to consider questions like;

- How do you, whether the Fountain Centre user or volunteer, think we should develop?
- Can you suggest ways we can improve our service, whether now or years down the line?
- Would you or anyone you know, make more use of the Fountain Centre style services if they were closer to where you live?
- How could the Fountain Centre facilities be better promoted to the public generally?

## The Cancer Education Programme

The *Cancer Education for Therapists* training days started in early February. The programme, put together by Charlotte McDowell, brings together our therapists and volunteers with clinical specialists from all over the hospital, to look at different cancers and treatment methods. So far it has proved very popular, and raised awareness of the work we do across the Hospital.

Diane Pedley, one of our Cranio-Sacral therapists, writes: “Over the course of the past two months, I've attended a series of talks given to the Fountain Centre therapists and volunteers by

Clinical Nurse Specialists and other hospital staff. I have found this educational programme interesting and informative, and it has greatly increased my knowledge of various types of cancers, conventional treatment options and possible side effects for patients.

“Being a hands-on therapist, I feel the toll that cancer takes on a patient or their carer's bodies, so I found the talks gave me a deeper understanding of the medical approach to the condition and what the patient may be experiencing on this difficult journey.

“A fundamental principle of complementary therapy is to treat patients as individuals so I was especially inspired by the efforts of hospital staff



in identifying the needs of the Teenagers and Young Adults group in devoting an area of the ward for their treatment. Our patients are very thankful to therapists and volunteers at The Fountain Centre, but I was particularly encouraged to hear a number of the speakers commenting on the difference the contribution the centre makes in supporting patients and their well-being.”

## New service – Bach Flower Therapy

The Bach Flower essences are very simple and safe to use. As we use alcohol free stock bottles there are no contra-indications for their use in The Fountain Centre. They work on mental and emotional stress rather than directly on the medical symptoms. Most people have heard of 'Rescue Remedy' but there are 38 different remedies which may be used in an endless number of combinations. Treatment bottles are made up differently for each individual, so you are given your own special combination at the close of a session. The appointments are an hour and can be booked in the usual way by telephone or through reception.

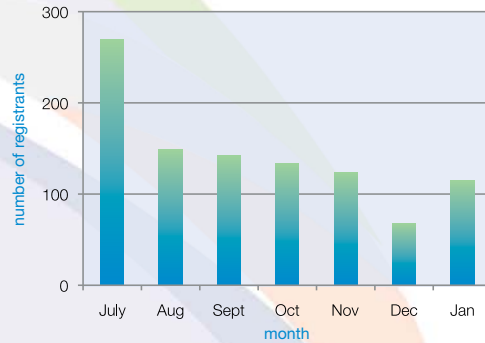
## 1001 new people since July 2012

1001 people registered at the Fountain Centre between 1st July 2012 and 31st January 2013, and 1980 appointments were made. We know, because our new database says so!

And these numbers only include people accessing Complementary Therapies, groups, CAB and Hairdressing Service. It does not include people accessing information, advice, social support or counselling – though since the end of January we have also been able to collect figures for counselling referrals.

So what? The data can tell us many useful things to help us plan for the future and prepare bids for funding, such as where patients come from geographically. And it can highlight areas where we may be able to boost our services, such as letting more people know about what we can do for patients on the wards.

## New Diet and Cancer FAQs Web Page

Information on diet and cancer in the press, in books and magazines and on the internet can be very confusing. We have been working closely with the Fountain Centre to provide answers to some frequently asked questions. The information available on a new page of the website will provide you with general guidance on what to eat when diagnosed with cancer and during cancer treatment. The advice is based on sound scientific evidence and aims to dispel the many myths about diet and cancer. It will hopefully provide some useful tools to eat well during treatment.

If you have a general question about diet which has not been answered, please contact the Fountain Centre who will pass on the details to the Oncology Dietitians. Answers will then be posted on the website.

It is worth bearing in mind that the advice on the website may not be suitable for everyone and if you have particular concerns and would like an appointment with a dietitian, then please contact the Fountain Centre who will provide details of how to self-refer to the department.

We are also involved with the Fountain Centre's drop-in sessions for patients and carers. If you or a relative have any questions, but don't necessarily require a referral to the dietitian, please feel free to attend our session. Details are available from the Fountain Centre.

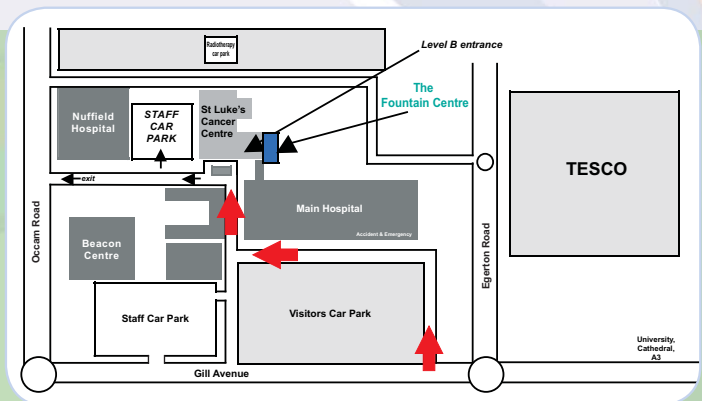
